The program provides shelter, three meals daily, and employment assistance for homeless men on the Eastside. to return them to being members of the community. The Boeing Employees Good Neighbor Fund has approved the program as a recipient of their Positive Designation program. We contract with Catholic Community Services to manage the program. We thank Randall Simmons, a member of St. Margaret's Episcopal Church, for regular monthly support; and numerous volunteers for support of this four-year old program.

The Task Force is in its fourth year of providing shelter, three meals per day, and social services for homeless men at congregational facilities. Host congregations, who provide facilities for a month, are assisted by support congregations and other volunteers with financial and volunteer support.

WELCOME TO EASTSIDE INTERFAITH

Welcome, visitors and members, to Eastside Interfaith Social Concerns Council (EISCC). The Council provides a forum for exchange of information among Eastside congregations, and encourages interfaith dialogue.
