- Congregations4Kids: <a href="http://congregations4kids.org/">http://congregations4kids.org/</a> We will be helping up to 2200 students, which include extras the district is projecting. We will be providing up to 1125 of them with backpacks, which also include extras that were requested by the district. We will provide school supplies for home use for all the school family connection centers, and students may request them there. The district is providing basic school supplies for community classroom use for all students this year, which is a change. The project will take place at Tillicum Middle School beginning in mid-August, with donations of backpacks and money turned in Aug. 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>. Number of donor congregations who have said they will participate is down this year, to just 10. We would still like to have additional ones.   - The Theory of Change: to engage with other community partners and build off of centering around the voice of those with lived experience; opportunities for resolution, healing and justice; started in 2016, stalled during pandemic, today guides renewed agency for individuals within King Co.; looking to provide restorative justice and a more humane approach to the housing journey;
  - Advocating for the following:
    - connecting an unhoused individual and an uninhabited unit of housing (which is a very sophisticated view of a very complex problem);

- advocating for rent control;
- many life issues become extremely complex when an individual loses their housing for a year or more;
- Housing Command Center provides navigation to connect individuals to available housing; support for up to two years to help the individual become more stable in all aspects of life;

- Ombuds Office set-up to address issues as well as to create a record; currently a team of two but in the process of hiring more individuals; <a href="https://kcrha.org/resources/ombuds/">https://kcrha.org/resources/ombuds/</a>;
- Knowledge of available spaces—King Co. has a rental registry; this identifies empty units; the
  challenge is affordable vs. not affordable; Tiny Home Villages—can operate staffed or
  unstaffed; this is dependent on the needs of each group; Marvin discussed how this
  approach could be more effective if the Tiny Homes were developed along with developing
  community;
- Both Mallory <u>Mallory.vanabbema@kcrha.org</u> and Marvin acknowledge the importance of faith-based communities and the work they have been called to do over time.
- KCRHA matches/aligns available regional service partners with individual or collective needs through Coordinated Entry (although there are not enough resources).
